# Words from Spencer Parrish on his recent trip to Poland:

"March 1<sup>st</sup> saw me driving to Louisville, Kentucky to compete in the United States Track & Field Indoor competition. After winning 2 bronze medals for the 1500 and 3,000 meter race walks, it was back to CT to pack another bag and fly to Poland. In Poland, I was representing the United States in the 3,000 and 10,000 (6.2 miles) meters race walks at the World Masters Indoor Track and Field competition. I was successful in

winning 2 individual gold medals and a Silver medal as a member of the U.S. Race Walking Team. The weather was 28 -36F cold rain, wind and snow. After that effort, I became a tourist traveling a thousand miles by train to different cities. In addition to sightseeing, my intent was to find Ukrainian children living there away from the war. To that end I was successful before I returned home on April 6th. Those that I found were on the streets in the rain trying to raise money to help with their living and staying alive. (This is tearful for me and I will say no more.) I did see the President of Ukraine receive Poland's highest award the Silver Eagle. Security was not happy when I took my camera out. Cell phones were ok, so no cell phone, no pics. So I left."






# Exchange Club of Waterbury Turns 75 Years Old Today April 12, 2023
















